We know that in our own family, the day to day living and need to get things done, sometimes distracts us from noticing the good and commenting on it.

Paul had this wonderful way of starting most of his letters, "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you,..." (Romans 1:8); "I give thanks to my God always for you..." (1 Corinthians 1:4); "In our prayers for you we always thank God..." (Colossians 1:3).



PITTSBURGH WALK FOR AUTISM RESEARCH

The Eighth Annual Pittsburgh Walk for Autism Research will take place Saturday morning, June 2, 2007 at Heinz Field, 900 Art Rooney Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15212. Registration and other activities begin at 8:00 am and the Walk will begin at 10:00 am. The distance of the walk is three miles.

For the third year there will be a Bower Hill Community Church Team walking to help raise public awareness about Autism by joining the Autism Speaks Walk for Autism Research. Autism Speaks is a nonprofit organization dedicated to bringing hope

to all who struggle with autism spectrum disorders. The primary goals are to raise public awareness about autism and to fund biomedical research that will lead to better treatment and, ultimately, a cure.

Thirteen years ago, 1 in 10,000 children was diagnosed with autism. Today that number has risen to 1 in 150 and with 1 in 97 boys given that diagnosis! Every 20 minutes another child is diagnosed. Money for research is vital to address this crisis. In our congregation, the pastors' two boys suffer from a mild form of autism called Asperser's Syndrome.

There are many others just in our locality.


